## July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021

The Nebraska Lottery reached new heights during fiscal year 2021.
Lottery sales reached $\$ 205.2$ million, and transfers to the beneficiary funds were $\$ 48.1$ million. These figures are evidence of the appeal of the products, the loyalty of players and retailers, and the efficiency of our organization.

The continuing coronavirus pandemic opened up new ways of connecting with players and changed how consumers shop for products, including lottery tickets. New partnerships resulted in successful Scratch games, and one lucky Nebraska Powerball player participated in the national Powerball First Millionaire of the Year promotion. Lottery beneficiaries continued to build a better Nebraska using lottery proceeds. Additional details on these items can be found in this report.

Finally, we continued a long-standing relationship with retailers, who received $\$ 13.5$ million in commissions during the fiscal year. Other highlights for the fiscal year include:

- Collected $\$ 706,873$ in state income taxes from prize winnings;
- Collected $\$ 17,829$ in unpaid taxes; and
- Collected $\$ 11,716$ in unpaid child support.

We look forward to continuing to serve the citizens of our state by providing them with quality entertainment, and by supporting good causes with Lottery proceeds. Together, we are Helping to Build a Better Nebraska ${ }^{\circledR}$.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

The Nebraska Lottery sells $\$ 1, \$ 2, \$ 3, \$ 5, \$ 10$, and $\$ 20$ Scratch tickets, with prizes ranging from a free $\$ 1$ ticket up to $\$ 200,000$ cash. A variety of Scratch games were developed and offered during the course of the year.

The Nebraska Lottery sells Lotto (online) games such as Lucky for Life ${ }^{\circledR}$, Powerball ${ }^{\circledR}$, Mega Millions ${ }^{\circledR}, 2$ by $2^{\circledR}$, MyDaY $^{\circledR}$, Nebraska Pick $3^{\circledR}$, and Nebraska Pick $5^{\circledR}$. MyDaY, Nebraska Pick 5, and Nebraska Pick 3 are offered exclusively in Nebraska. Powerball and 2by2 are operated on behalf of member lotteries by the Multi-State Lottery Association; and Lucky for Life and Mega Millions are operated by their member lotteries. Drawings for 2by2, Lucky for Life, and Nebraska-exclusive Lotto games are held every night. Powerball drawings are held three nights a week, and Mega Millions drawings are held twice per week. The price for a single play of most games is $\$ 1$, except for Lucky for Life, Mega Millions, and Powerball, which are $\$ 2$ per play. Lotto prizes range from a free ticket up to a multi-million-dollar jackpot.

Nebraska Lottery Scratch and Lotto game products, equipment, and services are provided by International Game Technology (IGT), which employs 40 people across Nebraska. Tickets and equipment are distributed from the IGT warehouse in Lincoln. The Nebraska Lottery contracts with Smith Kroeger of Omaha for advertising development and marketing-related services. Security and audit services are provided under contract with other Nebraska firms.

There are 21 Nebraska Lottery state employees providing accounting, marketing, communication, information technology, security, and general administrative services.

## Terminal System Conversion

A major initiative undertaken during this fiscal year was the conversion of retailer equipment and systems that will underpin the Lottery's operations for the next several years.

In August 2020, a new contract was awarded to International Game Technology (IGT) to continue as the provider of Instant and Online games and related services. Shortly afterwards the Lottery and IGT began working on the new system.

The conversion process was split into two parts. The emulation phase began in June 2021 when new Retailer Pro terminals and peripherals were installed at all Nebraska Lottery retailers. While the equipment was brand new, the terminal software emulated the previous system software retailers were already familiar with, allowing stores to sell lottery products with minimal interruption.

The final conversion happened in October 2021, when the retailer terminals and backend system were converted to the new Aurora system. The Lottery anticipates the system conversion will bring increased efficiency and cost savings while providing new features for players and retailers.

## COVID- <br> Response

As the coronavirus pandemic continued to the impact our state, the Nebraska Lottery faced several challenges and opportunities.

Most retailers remained open during the pandemic and continued to sell Lottery products. Ticket sales increased as other forms of entertainment became unavailable. Research confirmed the anecdotal evidence from retailers and Lottery Sales Representatives that new and lapsed players were purchasing tickets.

The Lottery made engaging and retaining these players a business goal for the fiscal year. All aspects of the Lottery's promotional efforts were evaluated, and new strategies for player retention were developed. For example, the reward for new MVP Club member registrations was increased from one free Nebraska Pick 5 play to five Nebraska Pick 5 plays and MVP Club members that participated in research surveys at nelottery.com were rewarded with an eCoupon for a free $\$ 5$ Scratch ticket.

## Facebook Live Giveaways

Another aspect of Lottery operations impacted by the coronavirus pandemic was the summer event tour. Normally Lottery Ambassadors attend fairs, festivals, and other events, but most of these events were cancelled in 2020.

To replace in-person events, a series of Facebook Live events was launched in June 2020. Players could register each week for a chance to be a virtual contestant in six Sizzling Summer Giveaway events. Lottery staff spun a prize wheel to determine the amount of Scratch tickets won for each contestant. Viewers at home also had the chance to watch and win Scratch tickets by answering trivia questions in the comments section during each broadcast.

The Sizzling Summer Giveaway gave the Lottery a way to maintain relationships with players during the pandemic. Response to the contest was overwhelmingly positive, so additional Facebook Live events using the same formula were held in October, November and December 2020, and in March, April and May 2021.

## POWER FIRST WMLIMNANE OF THE YEAR"

One lucky Nebraska Lottery MVP Club member got the chance to ring in 2021 with cash and prizes in the Powerball First Millionaire of the Year promotion.

In October 2020, the 13 for $\$ 1,300$ promotion gave Nebraska Lottery players the chance to win $\$ 1,300$ and be entered into a national drawing for a chance to win $\$ 1$ million live during Dick Clark's New Year's Rockin' Eve. Thirteen winners were drawn and submitted to the Multi-State Lottery Association for the national drawing.

Out of the entries received from all the participating lotteries, Shawn Cantrell of Lincoln was chosen as one of five finalists to compete for the title of Powerball First Millionaire of the Year. Viewers across the globe watched the live drawing just after midnight Eastern Time on New Year's morning. Cantrell didn't win the million-dollar prize, but he did win an at-home party package with cash, a 70-inch LED TV, karaoke system, and more.


## SCRRTCH DEVELOPMENTS

Sales of Nebraska Lottery Scratch tickets increased $10.1 \%$ over the previous fiscal year. Games produced in partnership with Nebraska organizations and games with innovative prize structures were responsible for this success.

## Game Partnerships: Brew Bucks and Nebraska State Parks Centennial

Two partnerships with Nebraska organizations produced successful Scratch games during the fiscal year.


The \$2 Brew Bucks Scratch game launched on April 14, 2021. The game was developed in partnership with the Nebraska Craft Brewers Guild, an industry organization representing Nebraska brewers. The NCBG logo was prominently featured on each Brew Bucks ticket, and the Guild provided Enthusiast Memberships for special offers and discounts at participating breweries. Ten memberships were given away in a social media promotion April 20 - 27 which had 1,058 entries.

2021 marked the 100th anniversary of the Nebraska state parks system. To celebrate, the Nebraska Lottery partnered with the Nebraska Game \& Parks Commission to produce the \$5 Nebraska State Parks Centennial Scratch game. The game featured an outdoors theme with game symbols derived from the Parks Centennial logo. Players could win thousands of cash prizes up to $\$ 40,000$.

Non-winning Nebraska State Parks Centennial tickets could be entered at nelottery.com in the Great Outdoors Getaway promotion April 26 - June 8, 2021. Entrants could choose between a Glamping package or a Family Package when entering their tickets. Each package included a stay at selected Nebraska state parks, $\$ 2,021$ cash, NEBRASKAland Magazine subscription, Nebraska State Parks pass and other items from the Nebraska Lottery and the Nebraska Game \& Parks Commission. 9,670 entries were received for the promotion, and $9.9 \%$ of entrants joined the Lottery's MVP Club
 specifically to enter the promotion.

## Prize Structure Variations Produce Results

The Nebraska Lottery is experimenting with new game prize structures to produce more appealing Scratch games.

No-break-even Scratch games have a minimum prize that is higher than the cost of a ticket. For example, the lowest amount that could be won in the $\$ 5$ Wild Red Sevens game was $\$ 10$. Players appreciate winning back more than what they spent on a ticket. Wild Red Sevens was launched in January 2021 and was very popular. It now ranks as one of the Lottery's top \$5 Scratch games.

Another type of Scratch game the Lottery had success with is low top prize games. Instead of a few large top prizes, these games offer thousands of smaller top prizes. The $\$ 10$ Scratch game Win $\$ 20, \$ 50$, or $\$ 100$ contained only three prize levels, but the odds of winning one of the $10,000 \$ 100$ prizes were 1 in 30 . The first version of Win $\$ 20, \$ 50$, or $\$ 100$ launched in June 2020. Sales were strong from the beginning, and a second printing was ordered to keep up with demand.

Games like Wild Red Sevens and Win $\$ 20, \$ 50$, or $\$ 100$ were designed using data from the Nebraska Lottery's ongoing research. Prize structure testing has been conducted since January 2015. Every Scratch price point from $\$ 1$ to $\$ 20$ has been tested, and the results provide valuable insights into player preferences so the Lottery can optimize prizes structures for Nebraska consumers.

## RETRILERS

The Nebraska Lottery sells Scratch and Lotto tickets through a retailer network of approximately 1,200 locations statewide. Nebraska Lottery retailers range from convenience stores and truck stops to supermarkets. Nebraska Lottery tickets may not be sold in establishments licensed for the consumption of alcohol. Players must be at least 19 years old to purchase and redeem Nebraska Lottery tickets.

Previous research among retailers found that carrying Lottery tickets is viewed as a customer service by $62 \%$ of retailers responding. Another $36 \%$ of retailers said they believe Lottery tickets are both a customer service and a profit center for their stores.

During the fiscal year, the Lottery processed 37 new retailer applications and 49 retailer changes of ownership. The statewide sales leaders for the fiscal year are listed here.

## BENEFICIRRY SUPPORT

Proceeds from the Nebraska Lottery benefit the environment, education, the Nebraska State Fair and compulsive gamblers assistance. The Nebraska Lottery transferred $\$ 48,178,938$ to its beneficiaries during the fiscal year, bringing the overall total to $\$ 831,069,951$ since operations began on September 11, 1993.

Amendment 4, passed by Nebraska voters in November 2004, established the following distribution formula:

- Education (44.5\%)*, as directed by the Legislature, is currently distributed to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund;
- Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund (44.5\%);
- Nebraska State Fair (10\%); and
- Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund (1\%), plus the first $\$ 500,000$ in fund proceeds each fiscal year.

## Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the business-type activities of the Nebraska Department of Revenue, Lottery Division (Nebraska Lottery), as of and for the year ended June 30, 2021, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Nebraska Lottery's basic financial statements, as listed in the Table of Contents.
Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements
Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

## Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.
An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. ## Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the business-type activities of the Nebraska Lottery, as of June 30, 2021, and the respective changes in financial position and cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

## Emphasis of Matter

As discussed in Note 1, the financial statements of the Nebraska Lottery are intended to present the financial position and the changes in financial position of only that portion of the business activities of the State that is attributable to the transactions of the Nebraska Lottery. They do not purport to, and do not, present fairly the financial position of the State of Nebraska as of June 30, 2021, and the changes in its financial position, or its cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

## Other Matters

## Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the Management's Discussion and Analysis on pages 7-10 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

## Other Information

The statistical section has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on it.

## Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we have also issued our report dated September 24, 2021, on our consideration of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to solely describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards in considering the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIRL STRTEMENTS

## For The Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2021

## 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## A. Basis of Presentation

The accompanying basic financial statements of the Nebraska Department of Revenue, Lottery Division, (Nebraska Lottery) have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP), as applied to governmental units. As the Nebraska Lottery is a business-type activity, the financial statements presented are the financial statements required by Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement Number 34 for an enterprise fund. GASB is the accepted standard-setting body for establishing governmental accounting and financial reporting principles.

The basic financial statements have been prepared primarily from data maintained by the Nebraska Lottery on computer systems provided by the lottery-services vendor and from accounts maintained by the State Accounting Administrator of the Department of Administrative Services.

## B. Reporting Entity

The Nebraska Lottery was created on February 24, 1993, by the Nebraska Legislature as a division of the Nebraska Department of Revenue (Department), established under and governed by the laws of the State of Nebraska. As such, the Nebraska Lottery is exempt from State and Federal income taxes. The financial statements include all funds of the Nebraska Lottery. The Nebraska Lottery is to provide an instant win and a random number selection on-line lottery. The net proceeds, as outlined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 9-812 (2021 Neb. Laws, LB 528, § 2), are to be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, and the Nebraska State Fair Support and Improvement Cash Fund, a fund of the State Fair Board. The financial statements include only the Nebraska Lottery and are not intended to present the financial position of the Department or the results of operations and changes in net positions of the Department as a whole. The Department is part of the primary government for the State of Nebraska's reporting entity.

The Nebraska Lottery has also considered all potential component units for which it is financially accountable, including other organizations that are fiscally dependent on the Nebraska Lottery or whose relationship with the Nebraska Lottery is so significant that exclusion would be misleading or incomplete. GASB has set forth criteria to be considered in determining financial accountability. These criteria include appointing a voting majority of an organization's governing body, and (1) the ability of the Nebraska Lottery to impose its will on that organization, or (2) the potential for the organization to provide specific financial benefits to, or impose specific financial burdens on, the Nebraska Lottery. The Nebraska Lottery is also considered financially accountable if an organization is fiscally dependent on it, and there is potential for the organization to provide specific financial benefits to, or impose specific financial burdens on, the Nebraska Lottery, regardless of whether the organization has (1) a separately elected governing board, (2) a governing board appointed by a higher level of government, or (3) a jointly appointed board.

These financial statements present the Nebraska Lottery. No component units were identified. The Nebraska Lottery is part of the primary government for the State of Nebraska's reporting entity.

## C. Measurement Focus, Basis of Accounting

The accounting and financial reporting treatment applied to a fund is determined by its measurement focus and basis of accounting. Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. Basis of accounting relates to the timing of the measurements made, regardless of the measurement focus applied.

The Nebraska Lottery's financial statements were reported using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. With the economic resources measurement focus, all assets and all liabilities associated with the operations are included on the Statement of Net Position. Revenues are recorded when earned, and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Net Position is segregated into restricted and unrestricted. The Nebraska Lottery's operating statements present increases (e.g., revenues) and decreases (e.g., expenses) in net position.

It is the policy of the State to spend restricted resources only when unrestricted resources are insufficient or unavailable. When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the Nebraska Lottery's policy to use unrestricted resources first, then restricted resources, as they are needed.

Revenues generated from the sale of lottery tickets are reported as operating revenues. Transactions that are capital financing, non-capital financing, or investing related are reported as non-operating revenues. All expenses related to operating the Nebraska Lottery are reported as operating expenses. All other expenses are reported as non-operating expenses.

Instant ticket revenue is recognized when tickets are sold to the retailer, and on-line revenue is recognized after the drawing is completed for the respective wagers. A $5.0 \%-6.0 \%$ retailer commission and a prize expense are recognized at the same time. Revenues from the sale of on-line tickets for future drawings and the related agent commission and prize expense are deferred until the drawings are held.

Prize expense is recognized in the same period ticket revenue is recognized based on the predetermined prize structure for each game. Because the instant prize-winning tickets are randomly distributed throughout the tickets, and some winning tickets will be lost, destroyed, or unredeemed for other reasons, there will be differences between amounts accrued and the amounts actually paid. These differences, denoted as unclaimed prizes, are recognized as a reduction of prize expense 181 days after the close of each instant game and 181 days after each draw for on-line games, as prizes unclaimed for 180 days expire. Unclaimed prizes for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021, totaled \$3,532,674

The activities of the Nebraska Lottery are accounted for as an enterprise fund. Enterprise funds are used to account for governmental operations that are financed and operated in a manner similar to private business enterprises and where the governing body has decided that periodic determination of revenues earned, expenses incurred, and net position is appropriate.

## D. Cash and Cash Equivalents

In addition to bank accounts and petty cash, this classification includes all short-term investments, such as certificates of deposit, repurchase agreements, and U.S. treasury bills. These short-term investments may have original maturities (remaining time to maturity at acquisition) greater than three months; however, cash is available and is considered cash and cash equivalents for reporting purposes. These investments are stated at cost, which at June 30, 2021, approximates market. Banks pledge collateral, as required by law, to guarantee State funds held in time and demand deposits.

Cash and cash equivalents are under the control of the State Treasurer or other administrative bodies, as determined by law. All cash deposited with the State Treasurer is initially maintained in a pooled cash account. On a daily basis, the State Treasurer invests cash not needed for current operations with the State's Investment Council, which maintains an operating investment pool for such investments. Interest earned on these investments is allocated to funds based on their percentage of the investment pool.

## E. Budgetary Process

The State's biennial budget cycle ends on June 30 of the odd-numbered years. By September 15, prior to a biennium, the Nebraska Lottery and all other State agencies must submit their budget requests for the biennium beginning the following July 1. The requests are submitted on forms that show estimated funding requirements by programs, sub-programs, and activities. The Executive Branch reviews the requests, establishes priorities, and balances the budget within the estimated resources available during the upcoming biennium.

The Governor's budget bill is submitted to the Legislature in January. The Legislature considers revisions to the bill and presents the appropriations bill to the Governor for signature. The Governor may: a) approve the appropriations bill in its entirety; b) veto the bill; or c) line item veto certain sections of the bill. Any vetoed bill or line item can be overridden by a three-fifths vote of the Legislature.

The approved appropriations will generally set spending limits for a particular program within the agency. Within the agency or program, the Legislature may provide funding from one to five budgetary fund types. Thus, the control is by fund type, within a program, within an agency.

Appropriations are usually made for each year of the biennium, with unexpended balances being reappropriated at the end of the first year of the biennium. For most appropriations, balances lapse at the end of the biennium.

All State budgetary expenditures for the enterprise fund type are made pursuant to the appropriations, which may be amended by the Legislature, upon approval by the Governor. State agencies may reallocate the appropriations between major objects of expenditure accounts, except that the Legislature's approval is required to exceed the personal service limitations contained in the appropriations bill. Increases in total appropriations must also be approved by the Legislature as a deficit appropriations bill.

Revenues are not budgeted.

## F. Receivables

Receivables are reported net of estimated allowances for uncollectible amounts, which are estimated based upon past collection experience and current economic conditions.

## G. Capital Assets

Capital assets include equipment that is valued at cost when historical records are available and at estimated historical cost when no historical records exist. Donated capital assets are valued at their estimated fair market value on the date received. Generally, equipment that has a cost in excess of $\$ 5,000$ at the date of acquisition and has an expected useful life of more than one year is capitalized. Computers are an exception to this policy and are capitalized if they have a cost in excess of $\$ 1,500$ and a useful life of more than one year.

Equipment is depreciated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of three to seven years.

## H. Compensated Absences

All permanent employees working for the Nebraska Lottery earn sick and annual leave and are allowed to accumulate compensatory leave rather than being paid overtime. Temporary and intermittent employees are not eligible for paid leave. The liability has been calculated using the vesting method, in which leave amounts, for both employees currently eligible to receive termination payments and other employees expected to become eligible in the future to receive such payments upon termination, are included.

Nebraska Lottery employees accrue vested annual leave at a variable rate based on years of service. Generally, accrued annual leave cannot exceed 35 days at the end of a calendar year.

Employees accrue sick leave at a variable rate based on years of service. In general, accrued sick leave cannot exceed 180 days. There is no maximum limit on the accumulation of sick leave days for employees under certain labor contracts. Sick leave is not vested except upon either death or reaching the retirement eligibility age of 55 , at which time the State is liable for 25 percent of the employee's accumulated sick leave. Employees under certain labor contracts can only be paid a maximum of 50 or 60 days.

The Nebraska Lottery's financial statements recognize the expense and accrued liability when vacation and compensatory leave is earned or when sick leave is expected to be paid as termination payments.

## I. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at June 30, 2021, and revenues and expenditures during the eporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

## 2. DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

Investment of all available cash is made by the State Investment Officer on a daily basis, based on total bank balances. These funds are held in the State of Nebraska Operating Investment Pool (OIP), an internal investment pool. Additional information on the deposits and investments portfolio, including investment policies, risks, and types of investments, can be found in the State of Nebraska's Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR).

## 3. CONTINGENCIES AND COMMITMENTS

Risk Management. The Nebraska Lottery is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets, errors or omissions, injuries to employees, and natural disasters. The Nebraska Lottery, as part of the primary government for the State, participates in the State's risk management program. The Nebraska Department of Administrative Services is responsible for maintaining the insurance and self-insurance programs for the State. The State generally self-insures for general liability, employee health care, employee indemnification, and workers' compensation. The State has chosen to purchase insurance for:
A. Motor vehicle liability, which includes $\$ 4,700,000$ with a self-insured retention of $\$ 300,000$ (coverage includes hot pursuit). There is an additional one-time corridor retention of $\$ 300,000$. Insurance is also purchased, with various limits and deductibles, for physical damage and uninsured and underinsured motorists. State agencies have the option to purchase coverage for physical damage to vehicles. There is a $\$ 1,000$ deductible for this coverage.
B. Life insurance for eligible employees.
C. Crime coverage, with a limit of $\$ 10,975,000$ for each loss and a $\$ 25,000$ self-insured retention per incident subject to specific conditions, limits, and exclusions.
D. Real and personal property on a blanket basis for losses up to $\$ 200,700,000$, with a self-insured retention of $\$ 300,000$ per loss occurrence. Newly acquired properties are covered up to $\$ 5$ million for 30 days and $\$ 1$ million for 90 days, if the property has not been reported. If not reported after 90 days, the property is not covered. The perils of flood, earthquake, and acts of terrorism have various coverage, sub-limits, and self-insurance. State agencies have the option to purchase building contents and inland marine coverage.

Details of the various insurance coverages are available from the Nebraska Department of Administrative Services - Risk Management Division.

No settlements exceeded commercial insurance coverage in any of the past three fiscal years. Workers' compensation is funded in the Workers' Compensation Internal Service Fund through assessments on each agency based on total agency payroll and past experience. Tort claims, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets, errors or omissions, and natural disasters would be funded through the State General Fund or by individual agency assessments, as directed by the Legislature, unless covered by purchased insurance. No amounts for estimated claims have been reported in the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements. Health care insurance is funded in the Insurance Trust Funds through a combination of employee and State contributions.

Litigation. The potential amount of liability involved in litigation pending against the Nebraska Lottery, if any, could not be determined at this time. However, it is the Nebraska Lottery's opinion that final settlement of those matters should not have an adverse effect on the Nebraska Lottery's ability to administer current programs. Any judgment against the Nebraska Lottery would have to be processed through the State Claims Board and be approved by the Legislature.

## 4. STATE EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT PLAN (PLAN)

The single-employer Plan became effective by statute on January 1, 1964. The Plan consists of a defined contribution option and a cash balance benefit and is administered by the Nebraska Public Employees Retirement Systems. The cash balance benefit is a type of defined benefit plan. Each member employed and participating in the retirement system prior to January 1, 2003, elected either to continue participation in the defined contribution option or to begin participation in the cash balance benefit. The defined contribution option is closed to new entrants. All new members of the Plan on and after January 1,2003 , become members of the cash balance benefit. The benefits and funding policy of the Plan is established and can only be amended by the Nebraska Legislature.

All permanent full-time employees are required to begin participation in the retirement system upon employment. Prior to April 2011, all permanent part-time employees, who had attained the age of 20, could exercise the option to begin participation in the retirement system. Effective April 2011, the age requirement decreased to 18 .

Contribution. Per statute, each member contributes $4.8 \%$ of his or her monthly compensation. The Nebraska Lottery matches the member's contribution at a rate of $156 \%$. The employee's and employer's contributions are kept in separate accounts.

The employee's account is fully vested. The employer's account is fully vested after a total of three years of participation in the system, including credit for participation in another Nebraska governmental plan prior to actual contribution to the Plan.

Defined Contribution Option. Upon attainment of age 55, regardless of service, the retirement allowance is to be equal to the sum of the employee and employer accounts. Members have several forms of payment available, including withdrawals, deferrals, annuities, or a combination of these.

Cash Balance Benefit. Upon attainment of age 55, regardless of service, the retirement allowance shall be equal to the accumulated employee and employer cash balance accounts, including interest credits, annuitized for payment in the normal form. The normal form of payment is single life annuity with five-year certain, payable monthly. Members have the option to convert their member cash balance account to a monthly annuity with built in cost-of-living adjustments of $2.5 \%$ annually. Also available are additional forms of payment allowed under the State Plan that are actuarially equivalent to the normal form, including the option of lump-sum or partial lump-sum.

For the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021, employees contributed $\$ 61,085$, and the Nebraska Lottery contributed $\$ 95,293$. A separate plan report is issued by and can be obtained from the Nebraska Public Employees Retirement System. This report contains full pension-related disclosures.

The State of Nebraska Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) also includes pension-related disclosures. The ACFR report is available from the Nebraska Department of Administrative Services Accounting Division or on the Nebraska Auditor of Public Accounts' website at auditors.nebraska.gov.

## 5. RECEIVABLES

Retailers comprised principally of grocery stores, convenience stores, and off-sale liquor stores serve as the primary distribution channel for lottery sales to the general public. No one retailer accounts for a significant amount of the Nebraska Lottery's sales or accounts receivable. Retailers must pay for instant lottery tickets 45 days after activation or when the pack is $70 \%$ validated, whichever comes first. Retailers pay for on-line tickets each Wednesday for balances due through the previous Saturday. The retailers’ accounts receivable is net of allowance for uncollectible in the amount of $\$ 29,095$.

The Nebraska Lottery is a member of the Multi-State Lottery Association (MUSL), which operates games on behalf of participating state lotteries. Each MUSL member sells on-line game tickets through its agents and makes weekly payments to MUSL in an amount equal to each game's prize structure, less amounts retained for prizes paid directly to the winners by each member lottery. MUSL maintains prize reserve funds on some of the games to serve as a contingency reserve to protect from unforeseen prize liabilities. The money in these reserve funds is to be used at the discretion of the MUSL Board of Directors. The prize reserve funds are refundable to MUSL members if MUSL disbands or if a member leaves MUSL. Members leaving MUSL must wait at least one year before receiving their remaining share of the prize reserve funds.

In addition, the Nebraska Lottery has $\$ 309,309$ held by MUSL, reported on the Statement of Net Position as Reserves on Deposit (Current), which can be used to pay the Nebraska Lottery's portion of MUSL's operating budget, any MUSL legal expenses, and other expenses incurred by MUSL. These funds are not tied directly to any MUSL game.

The Powerball® and Mega Millions ${ }^{\circledR}$ grand prizes can be paid either as annual installments or as a lump sum cash payment, depending on the selection of the winner when claiming the prize. If the winner selects annual installments, MUSL purchases bonds, which are held in trust to fund the future installments. Maturities are staggered in order to provide adequate cash flow for each installment. MUSL is responsible for paying amounts owed to the grand prize winners. The assets and related liabilities are reflected in MUSL's financial statements and, therefore, are not reflected in the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements.

The Lucky for Life ${ }^{\circledR}$ top two prize levels can be paid either through annuity payments for the life of the winner or as a lump sum cash payment, depending on the selection of the winner when claiming the prize. If a Nebraska winner selects the annuity, the Nebraska Lottery has a contract with MUSL so that MUSL will secure bids from financial services companies to provide the annual payments directly to the winner. Each participating jurisdiction contributes a proportionate share to fund the annuity or lump sum payment. There were no Lucky for Life ${ }^{\circledR}$ top prize winners in Nebraska this fiscal year.

## 9. LEASE COMMITMENTS

The Nebraska Lottery leases office space under an operating lease. The following schedule for operating leases includes all leases for the Nebraska Lottery. Although the lease terms may vary, all leases are subject to annual appropriation by the Legislature.

The minimum annual lease payments for operating leases as of June 30, 2021, are as follows:

The Nebraska Lottery has the option to extend the lease agreement by two 5-year periods for a total additional period of 10 years. Total operating lease payments for the year ended June 30, 2021, were \$78,712.

## 10.SIGNIFICANT COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

Article III, § 24, of the Nebraska Constitution sets out the basic requirements for the transfer of lottery proceeds to certain beneficiary funds, specifying that a portion of those revenues are to "be used for education as the Legislature may direct[.]"

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 9-812(2) (2021 Neb. Laws, LB 528, § 2) offers the following legislative directive for the transfer of lottery proceeds:

A portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund as provided in subsection (3) of this section. The dollar amount transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the greater of (a) the dollar amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2002-03 or (b) any amount which constitutes at least twenty-two percent and no more than twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis. To the extent that funds are available, the Tax Commissioner and director may authorize a transfer exceeding twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets sold on an annualized basis.
Additionally, § 9-812(3) provides these further instructions:
Of the money available to be transferred to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:
(a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 9-1006;
(b) Beginning July 1, 2016, forty-four and one-half percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund;
(c) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be used as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act; (d) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within the county in which the fair is located provides matching funds equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such matching funds may be obtained from the city and any other private or public entity, except that no portion of such matching funds shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the General Fund; and
(e) One percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 9-1006.
As required under its enabling legislation, transfers of $\$ 48,178,938$ were made to other funds during the fiscal year. The Nebraska Lottery develops game structures to comply with the minimum prize provision of its enabling legislation, which requires a minimum of 40 percent to be paid in prizes.

The Nebraska Lottery compares the social security number of each winner who has a per-wager prize in excess of \$500 against a list of social security numbers having an outstanding State tax liability or delinquent child support payments. Any delinquent payments are withheld from winnings and forwarded to the appropriate State agency. During the fiscal year, the Nebraska Lottery collected $\$ 17,829$ in delinquent State taxes and $\$ 11,716$ in delinquent child support payments.

Operating Transfers In/Out will not balance, and Due To/From Other Funds will not balance, within the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements, as the Nebraska Lottery represents only part of the State's primary government.

## 11. NET POSITION

The Nebraska Lottery's unrestricted net position represents funds not legally restricted for any specific purpose; however, the funds may be used only to fund additional prize pay-outs, transfers to the beneficiary funds, or additional operating expenses of the Nebraska Lottery. Management's intention is to use the unrestricted net position to fund additional prize pay-outs, retailer incentives, and other game enhancements.
